As part of my duties within EDGE Unit, I provide expert drug opinion evidence for criminal and civil court proceedings.</p> | <p><b>Session 2 – EPS Gang Unit – Helping to Understand Drug Recognition, Gang Structure, &amp; Drug Distribution</b></p> <p><b>Activities of the EDGE Unit:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Coordinating and evaluating information received on street gangs;</li> <li>➤ Maintaining an ongoing central information base on gangs</li> <li>➤ offering assistance and information to members on street gangs;</li> <li>➤ Liaising with Media Relations Unit regarding gangs;</li> <li>➤ Providing assistance with members' investigations, should they require it;</li> <li>➤ Liaising with the community in developing problem solving solutions;</li> <li>➤ Targeting and disrupting organized criminal groups;</li> <li>➤ Attends all homicides including violent incidents believed to be gang related;</li> <li>➤ Identify illicit drug dealers through information sources, undercover operations, and police investigations, and gather evidence to support arrest and conviction;</li> <li>➤ Gather intelligence relating to the sale and distribution of illicit drugs and develop strategies to neutralize this criminal activity;</li> <li>➤ Organize and supervise covert drug operations and opportunities to purchase illicit drugs;</li> <li>➤ Provide expert testimony as a drug witness at the request of a Crown prosecutor;</li> <li>➤ Communicate with outside agencies, groups, and the media respecting public education and information of current problems and activities related to illicit drugs;</li> <li>➤ Exchange intelligence with other law enforcement agencies to counteract the movement of illicit drugs nationally and internationally;</li> <li>➤ Respond to incidents involving meth labs;</li> </ul> |
